Free Time in Brazil

Television is very popular in Brazil, but the hot weather makes city apartments uncomfortable and most leisure activities take place outdoors. Most Brazilians live near the coast. The *praia*, or beach, is the favourite place for people to spend their free time.

Football (US soccer) is the most popular sport and Brazilians take it very seriously. Since the World Cup started, Brazil has reached the final stages every time and has won the championship five times, in 1958, 1962, 1970, 1994 and 2002. The Brazilians play football everywhere. They play on the beach, in the streets, and anywhere where there is room to kick a ball around.

Brazilians are famous for their love of singing and dancing and samba is their national music. During Carnival time there is samba music day and night, and the streets become huge outdoor dance floors.
